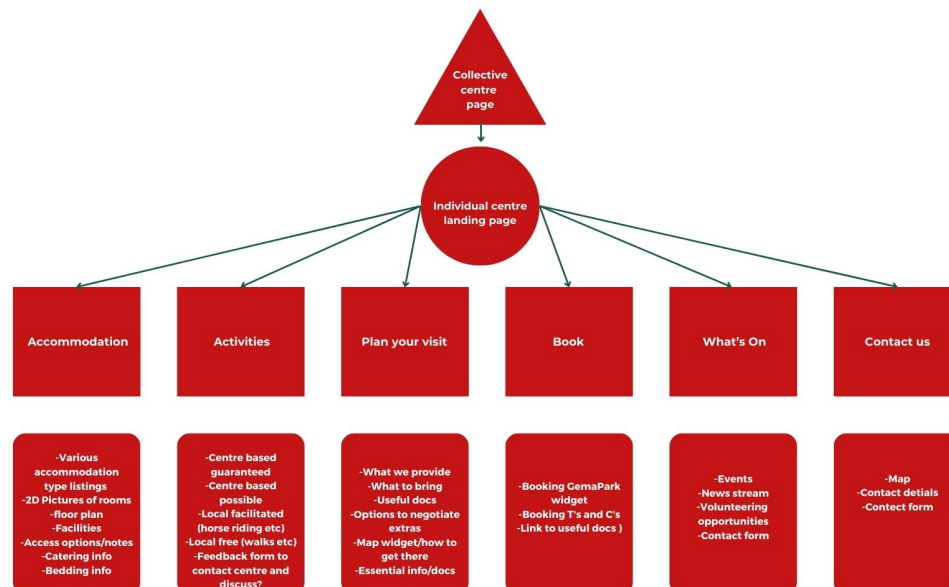

- Separate widget that is image and rich text that will be a section about Woodcraft Folk
- Each centre to have logo as part of a cohesive set that is in line with Woodcraft Folk brand guidelines
- Option to sign up to enewsletter widget - at the moment thinking this links to enews sign up on Woodcraft Folk site unless centres have specific ask just want to make sure feature is present

Accommodation

- Banner image at top of page
- Space for rich text at the top for centres to summarise accommodation offer
- Various accommodation listings - some centres have different types of accommodation so there needs to be functionality to add as well as be able to view different accommodation types. This could be a tiled widget with thumbnails of each accommodation type that you can click on to be taken to a sub page on each accommodation type for example. However, some centres don't have many accommodation options and could list all details of accommodation on offer via just an accommodation landing page that has image sliders and a space for rich text. Additionally, some centres need to split the accommodation types under different audiences e.g. youth/school groups v family/private bookings. This could be as simple as tiled widgets being split under different audience type headings or having one tiled widget that has a filtration feature for audience type.
- Floor plan - ability to add floor plan download for each accommodation type
- Facilities - rich text/bullet points for attachment/download each accommodation type - this could feature on accommodation type sub pages or on main accommodation landing page for centres with not many accommodation options
- 2D pictures of rooms - image gallery slider
- Option to add documents to view/download
- Catering/bedding info - likely to be attachments or rich texts at bottom of accommodation page
- Clear 'book here' button / widget that takes people through to booking page on accommodation landing page and any sub pages to do with accommodation
- Centre telephone number and email clearly displayed on this page
- Contact us form

Activities

- Banner image at top of page
- Space for rich text at the top of the landing page for centres to summarise activities offer
- Various activities listings - could be as thumbnail widgets with image of activity and name of activity. Like accommodation types, some centres will need to split the activity listings under different headers/filters
- Ideally each activity listing when clicked takes you to a sub page with more info on that particular activity. Sub page also allows for display images and ability to include attachments
- Contact us form and also contact details (phone and email address)

2.1.4 The Burrow

The Burrow is built into the slope of our camping area and is completely contained within a hedged field. This makes it particularly suitable for groups wanting defined boundaries. All the facilities are self-contained in the building and the doors can be closed securely at night.

For a truly outdoor experience the whole roof can slide back into the hillside, letting in the sun or giving you a great view on a starry night.

With sleeping accommodation for 19, the burrow is a truly unique place to stay.

Facilities

The central area is equipped with tables and benches, ready to be used as a dining or activity space.

To the rear is the kitchen area, comprising a sink with cold running water and worktops, with a four-burner inset gas-hob. The wood-burning stove adds a warm homely touch.

To the sides, canvas panels create the bedroom areas, each with bunkbeds. The larger room also has a single bed making access easier for those with limited mobility.

Room 1 – sleeps 2

Room 2 – sleeps 9

Room 3 – sleeps 6

Room 4 – sleeps 2

The burrow has its own spacious toilet with grab rails.

Outside, there's an enclosed field, ideal for campfires, games and team building activities. The possibilities are endless.

4. Height Gate (heightgate.woodcraft.org.uk)

Welcome to Height Gate Camping Barn

Height Gate, built as a farm in the 17th century and Grade II listed, sits just off the Pennine Way, high above the picturesque Calder Valley between Todmorden and Hebden Bridge.

Within one hour's drive of Manchester, Preston, Bradford and Leeds it is perfect for groups wanting to explore the South Pennines. The area is criss-crossed with mountain bike trails and footpaths, the pretty Rochdale Canal can be followed to either Todmorden or Hebden Bridge.

Available to hire on a sole use basis, the centre sleeps up to 32 across 4 rooms. Extra guests can be accommodated on camp beds and in tents within the 4 acres of grounds. The large barn space provides an excellent large indoor area ideal for larger gatherings and celebrations.

Prices start at £353 for a one night stay.

Height Gate is owned and managed by Woodcraft Folk, a co-operative youth movement open to everyone. We support children to take the lead and change their world through weekly group nights and camps. Woodcraft Folk activities develop children's understanding and respect of the world around them including activities which explore other cultures and the natural environment. We've been running since 1925 and we're still going strong!

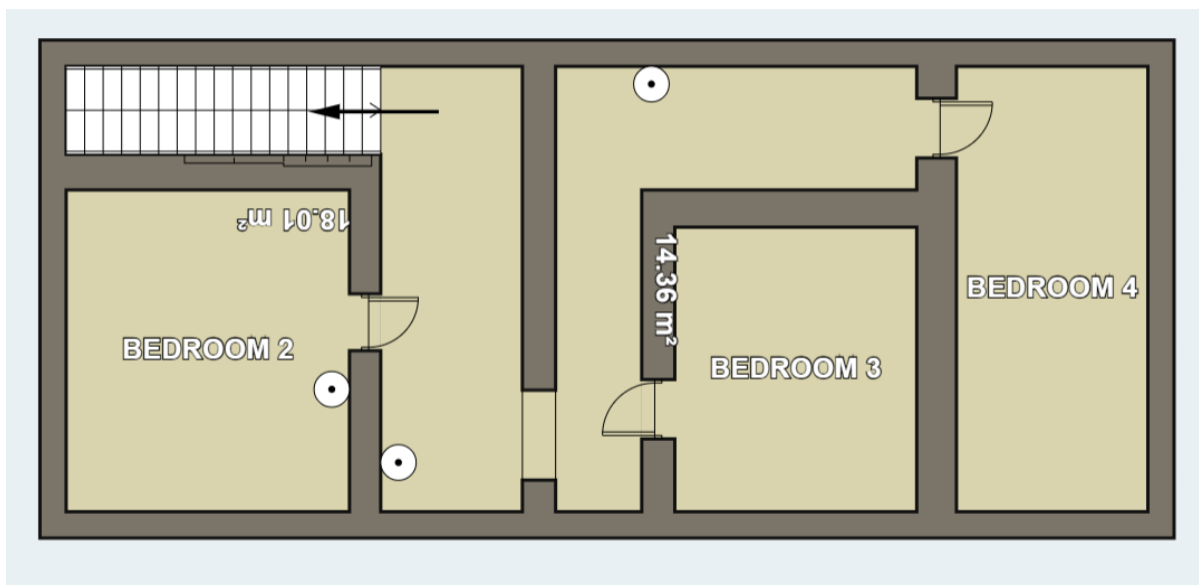
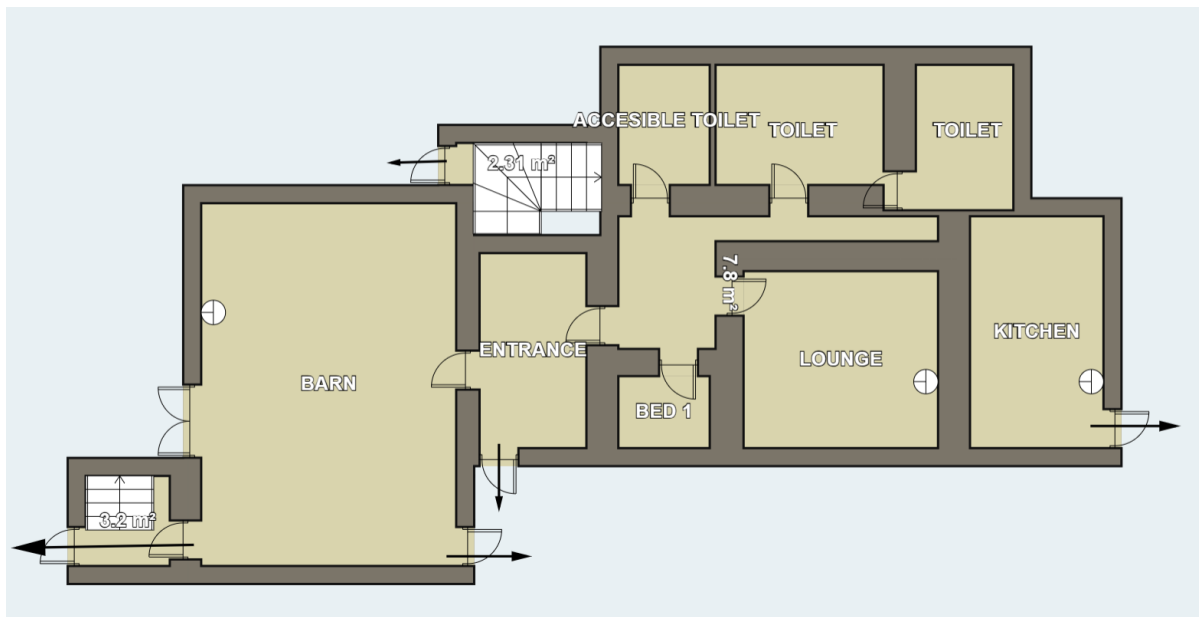
4.1 Accommodation

Height Gate can sleep up to 32 in bunk beds, plus additional guests camping outside in tents. Guests have to provide their own bedding. There are a total of

four bedrooms; the first bedroom is downstairs and accessible and has one 2 beds. The other three bedrooms are situated upstairs in a configuration of eight beds, ten beds and twelve beds.

Facilities

Facilities include a kitchen, well-equipped to cater for 32, with a large commercial 6-burner gas cooker, 2 fridges, freezer, microwave, toaster, kettles and plenty of

pans, crockery, utensils and cutlery. There's a communal lounge and a large indoor barn for activities.

There is one shower that is situated in an accessible wet room and toilet and 2 blocks of toilets.

Outside there's a fire pit, campfire area, a field for games or camping and parking for 8 cars.

Heating is provided by a wood pellet and multifuel stoves. A good supply of fuel is provided and included in the price.

Wifi is available on site

Dogs are welcome!! Just please don't let them upstairs with dirty paws.

What we provide

The lounge has a pellet stove which is used to warm the room as well as the hot water and radiators around the building. We will provide enough fuel for this for your stay.

The woodburners in the kitchen and barn space guest will need to provide their own fuel for these.

Toilet rolls: 12 per booking

Oven gloves and tea towels

Matches/stove lighter

Washing up liquid

Soap for hand washing

Cleaning products and cloths

We ask you to leave the site as you would like to find it, and take your rubbish with you.

Travelling by car

Its best to use 'Height Gate Camping Barn' in maps as opposed to the postcode.

Height Gate is reached by a hilly farm track about one mile up from the main road (A646 Halifax to Todmorden Road). Please note there are limited passing places along the track, so long steep reversing may be required. The track is not recommended for vehicles with low ground clearance.

We strongly encourage car sharing and keeping the number of vehicles going on the track to a minimum. Vehicles can be left at the valley bottom in the large layby on the main A646, 125m towards Hebden Bridge from the turning off to Height Gate.

To reach Height Gate, turn down Stoodley Glen by the Masons Lodge, drive over the canal, follow the tarmac road over the canal to a gate at the bottom of the track. Continue uphill on the winding track, taking the fork to the right near the top until you reach Height Gate on your left.

Do NOT drive through the large stone gate posts immediately after the top cattle grid. This is not the Height Gate Camping Barn nor is there any access to the camping barn via this private driveway.

There is parking for up to 8 small cars at Height Gate: 5 on the gravel parking area 50 metres on your left before Height Gate, 3 next to the building.

Travelling by public transport:

Both Hebden Bridge and Todmorden have railway stations on the Manchester-Leeds line, and buses run regularly along the A646 between the two towns. Get off at the Eastwood bus stop. Buses 591/592 run on this route. You can also walk from Hebden Bridge and Todmorden stations in approximately 1-1.5 hour.

To reach Height Gate from the layby, walk in the Todmorden direction for about 125 metres, turn down Stoodley Glen then walk the same route as the vehicle directions above.
